It remains one of the finest examples of value-capture in global PPP infrastructure markets, attracting a more than \$1 billion investment in a five-star quality hotel and a mixed-use development of more than 100,000 square metres.

With a 6 Star Green Star Design rating it is also one of the greenest convention centres in the world.





Expansion project

In mid-2018 Plenary, in partnership with the Victorian Government and private partners, completed a \$350 million expansion of the broader South Wharf precinct.

The project included a 20,000-square-metre expansion of Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre, a new 347-room, four-star quality hotel and a new 1,150-space multi-level car park.

The expansion increased MCEC's total size to more than 70,000 square metres, ensuring it remains the leading destination for business tourism and events in Australia.

Local economic impact

Job creation

Up to 1,300 people worked on site during construction of original Melbourne Convention Centre project.

More than 1,500 new permanent jobs have since been created by the private sector investment in the mixed-use retail, office, hotel, residential and food and beverage precinct.

More than 700 people were employed during construction of the expansion, which will also see tens of millions of dollars of work generated for Victorian businesses and suppliers.



Now complete, the expanded precinct is adding more than 900 ongoing jobs.

Design features

Environmental design

Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre has been awarded a 6 Star Green Star Design rating by the Green Building Council of Australia, and gold certification by leading tourism certification group EarthCheck, setting the global standard for sustainable convention centre design.

Flexibility seating and operable walls

A main feature of MCEC is its main hall, a flexible space that can be used as a 5,500 seat auditorium. The largest operable walls in the southern hemisphere and a unique retractable seating system allow the hall to be divided into three separate theatres, one with capacity for up to 2,500 people.

The hall is celebrated as a 'building within a building', wrapped by more than 16,000 square metres of foyer and event space, and banquet and meeting rooms.

Asset management innovations

Plenary's operational model provides significant innovation through a unique risk-and-reward sharing mechanism between Plenary and Brookfield GIS.

This cost-effective but hands-on approach allows significant savings to be returned to the State while ensuring Plenary is heavily incentivised to maintain the asset to a high standard throughout its life.
